The Heilbrunn Center was thrilled to welcome the Value Investing Program students back to campus in person for the Modern Value block week August 30, 2021 – September 3, 2021. After 18 months of virtual and hybrid teaching, Columbia University has retuned fully in person for the 2021-2022 academic year. As President Bollinger wrote in his September 1 letter "On Sunday, March 8, 2020, I wrote to share the news that we would cancel classes for two days because an individual on campus had been diagnosed with COVID-19. By Wednesday, teaching across the entire University had become remote and New York City was shutting down . . . Today I write finally—indeed, joyfully—to welcome you all back to campus." On September 10, 2021 we hosted the Value Investing Program Orientation and Welcome Reception giving students a chance to network with one another and the Heilbrunn adjunct faculty in person. We look forward to a wonderful academic year with both in-person and virtual opportunities to engage with the Center. We also look forward to the launch of the new Value Investing Program curriculum.

The Complete Investor from Debt to Equity and Beyond

After almost three years of meeting with key stakeholders, including alumni, adjunct faculty members, employers, and current students, the Heilbrunn Center completed a structural transformation to the Value Investing Program beginning in the 2021-2022 academic year.

Students in the Program will now take (1) Modern Value; (2) Applied Value Investing; (3) The Credit Superhighway; (4) Economics of Strategic Behavior; (5) Value Investing with Legends; and (6) two elective courses of the student's choosing from a prescribed menu of Heilbrunn Center courses. Allowed elective courses for the upcoming academic year include Activism as a Value Strategy taught by Professor Wei Jiang; Advanced Investment Research* taught by Kian Ghazi; Compounders* taught by Anouk Dey and Jeff Mueller '13; Debt Capital Markets taught by Suresh Sundaresan; Distressed Value Investing taught by Professor Dan Krueger '02; From Feast to Famine and Back Again taught by Ellen Carr; Mental Models* taught by Grant Bowman '10 and Brian Waterhouse '15; Short Selling taught by David Horn '02 and Jaime Lester '02; Value Investing Across the Capital Structure taught by Keith Luh '03; Value Investing in Credit Markets taught by Denis Tolkachev '15 and Anjali Verghis '15; and Value Investing in Private Credit taught by David Glazek '06 LAW and Mac Trivedi '14.

We are also thrilled to offer a new class, **The Equity Analyst's Toolkit**, taught by Mike Kimpel '12. This class is targeted toward first year students and is meant to bridge the gap between the Business School's core curriculum and skills needed for an investment management internship as well as the more advanced classes in a student's second year. In particular, this spring 2022 class will be of great benefit for career switchers and non-traditional students who plan to pursue a career in investment management.

Value Investing Program Class

The Value Investing Program Class of 2022 will be the first class to complete the new curriculum. Upon announcing the launch of the updated Program, applications for the 2021-2022 academic year were up by 25%. To see the full class list and students' LinkedIn profiles visit here. The acceptance rate for the Value Investing Program Class of 2022 was about 50%.

We are pleased to report that women make up 30% of the Value Investing Program Class of 2022 (up from 25% the two previous years). The Center launched a formal Women's Initiative in 2018 with the goal of increasing the number of women in the Value Investing Program and the pipeline of investment management overall and we are seeing progress through that initiative.

The 2016 vintage of the portfolio was liquidated to purchase the 2021 vintage.

The Center is pleased to report that the sale of the 2016 positions of the 5x5x5 Russo Student Investment Portfolio (AXTA, MA, MCO, ORLY, RR) resulted in a 134% increase in value over the five year holding period and outperformed the S&P by about 30% over the same time period.
