Taro Aso is the Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Finance, and Minister of State for Financial Services in Japan. He had previously served as Prime Minister, Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Minister for Internal Affairs and Communications. In 1979, he was elected as a member of the House of Representatives, and has been elected 12 times since. He had also served as CEO of Aso Cement Co., Ltd. before. He participated in the 1976 Montreal Olympic Games as an athlete of Japan (clay target shooting). He graduated from the Faculty of Politics and Economics at Gakushuin University. He was born in 1940. His birth place is in the Fukuoka Prefecture of, Japan.

Ito was Senior Advisor in the Research Department at the International Monetary Fund, Deputy Vice Minister for International Affairs at the Ministry of Finance of Japan, and a member of the Prime Minister's Council on Economic and Fiscal Policy. He was awarded the National Medal with Purple Ribbon by the Government of Japan in June 2011 for his excellent academic achievement.

David E. He also held professorships at the University of Michigan and Harvard University, and served on the Council of Economic Advisors from 1989 to 1990.

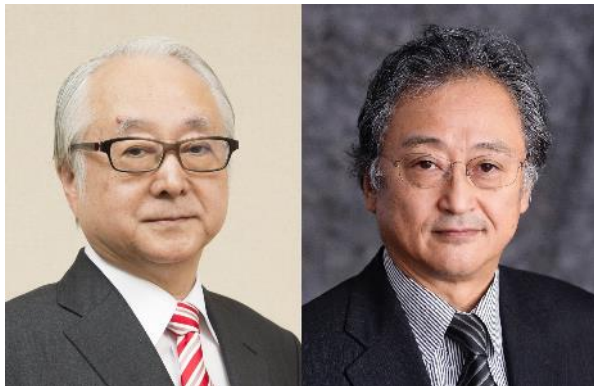

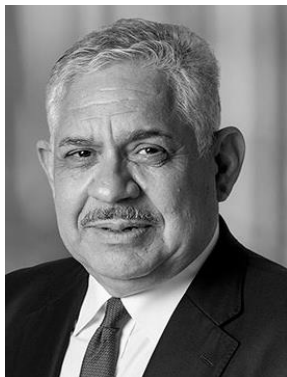
