Former Governor Kuroda's visit to Columbia University in the week of April 17 was the first time he openly spoke on his experiences conducting unconventional monetary policy for ten years, overcoming deflation and coming very close to achieving the 2% inflation target. He also discussed the future of the international monetary system, as he was previously responsible for Japan's international financial policies when he was Vice Minister of Finance for International Affairs and when he was leading the Asian Development Bank.
