NATIONAL PALACE MUSEUM

The largest collection of Chinese artifacts and artwork in the world

The National Palace Museum in Taipei houses the largest collection of Chinese artifacts and artwork in the world. The impressive permanent collection comprises more than 650,000 items.

Chinese history is told through bronze statues, jade carvings, calligraphy, lacquerware and other historical pieces – many of which belonged to Chinese imperial families – including an intriguingly life-like, meat-shaped stone and a jadeite cabbage.



TAROKO NATIONAL PARK

A captivating journey into the heart of Taiwan's eastern coast

Taroko National Park, nestled on Taiwan's east coast, is a natural marvel famed for its awe-inspiring marble gorges, lush forests, and abundant biodiversity. Named after the Taroko Gorge, which means "Magnificent and Beautiful" in the Truku indigenous language, the park showcases millions of years of geological forces shaping Taiwan, with deep canyons, towering cliffs, and meandering rivers etching a breathtaking landscape. Hikers can explore trails leading to scenic viewpoints, serene shrines, and hidden caves, while cultural heritage sites add a rich layer of history and tradition.

TAIPEI IOI

Taipei 101 is an iconic skyscraper and architectural marvel situated in the Xinyi District of Taipei, Taiwan. Completed in 2004, this towering structure held the title of the world's tallest building for several years. It's home to a vibrant shopping mall, various restaurants offering a wide range of cuisines, and corporate offices.

In addition to its role as a commercial and entertainment hub, Taipei 101 is a symbol of Taiwan's commitment to sustainable practices. It was one of the world's first skyscrapers to earn LEED Platinum certification for its eco-friendly features, including rainwater recycling, energy-efficient systems, and a mass damper system that counteracts sway during earthquakes and high winds.

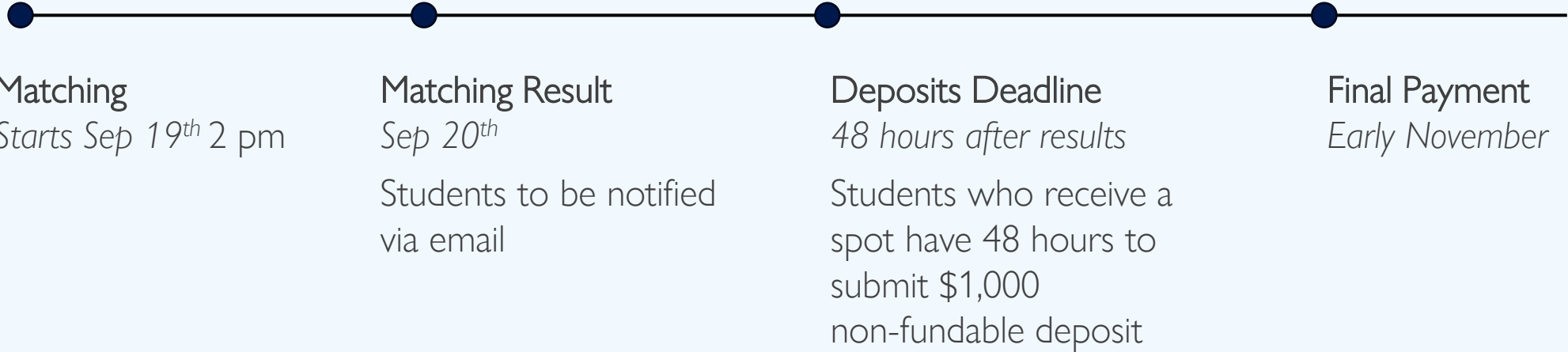
